CEC Fall/Winter Concert News

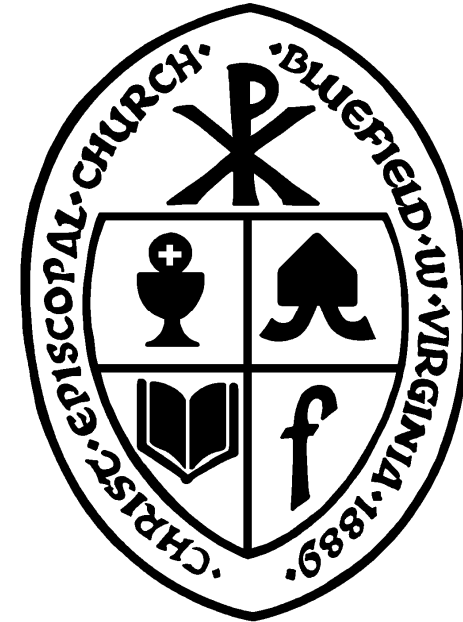
On Sunday, November 15th, the Bluefield State Community Choir, directed by Don Kensinger, will present a concert at 3p.m.
