

The First Lesson

Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14

As I watched, thrones were set in place, and an Ancient One took his throne, his clothing was white as snow, and the hair of his head like pure wool; his throne was fiery flames, and its wheels were burning fire.

A stream of fire issued and flowed out from his presence. A thousand thousands served him, and ten thousand times ten thousand stood attending him. The court sat in judgment, and the books were opened.

As I watched in the night visions, I saw one like a human being coming with the clouds of heaven. And he came to the Ancient One and was presented before him.

To him was given dominion and glory and kingship that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that shall not pass away, and his kingship is one that shall never be destroyed.

- 1 The Lord is King; he has put on splendid apparel; the Lord has put on his apparel and girded himself with strength.

- 3 Ever since the world began, your throne has been established; you are from everlasting.
- 4 The waters have lifted up, O Lord, the waters have lifted up their voice; the waters have lifted up their pounding waves.
- 5 Mightier than the sound of many waters, mightier than the breakers of the sea, mightier is the Lord who dwells on high.
- 6 Your testimonies are very sure, and holiness adorns your house, O Lord, for ever and for evermore.


Look! He is coming with the clouds;



The Distribution of the Holy Sacrament
All baptized Christians, of any tradition, are welcome to receive the sacrament. Everyone, regardless of faith, is welcome to receive a blessing—simply cross your arms in front of you as the priest comes by. It is the tradition of this parish that 12 to 14 people at a time receive Communion at the altar rail, at which point all are dismissed together to return to their seats, and another group may move forward to the rail. "BCP" is our abbreviation for "Book of Common Prayer," which is the smaller red book.
