Minutes-CEC Vestry Meeting September 20, 2023

A regularly scheduled meeting of the Vestry was held in the Library, beginning at 7:00 p.m.

Present Absent Mary Catherine Williams Vic Bowman Susanne Pulse Don Kersey Peter Richardson Betty Nash Mimi Merritt Becky Beckett Peter Taylor Also present was Father Paul Barker

Father Paul called the meeting to order and declared a quorum.

Mimi Merritt gave the devotional.

Mary Catherine Williams made the motion to approve the minutes of the August meeting and Betty Nash seconded the motion, and the minutes were unanimously approved.

The Vestry members reviewed the financial documents. Don Kersey gave the Treasurer's Financially the church remains in good condition. We started the year with report. significant income surpluses which are carrying us through the summer months which traditionally have been slow months for giving. Unrestricted income for the month was \$10,000 under budget but income for the year is \$1100 over budget due to the beginning surplus. \$1300 of unrestricted expense was spent on a computer for our priest. Food pantry income is \$2000 under budget year to date. No other significant unplanned expenses occurred in August. Our funds in our operating account decreased by \$9000 which is due to the income shortfall for the month of August. Our endowment funds decreased by over \$70,000 due to a drop in the stock market. Expected pledges to be received for the rest of the year are \$17,000. As a result I recommend we request a drawdown from the St Lucy fund to be received in October to cover planned expenses. The drawdown should be approximately \$14,000. Mary Catherine Williams made the motion to withdraw \$14,000 from the St. Lucy Fund for the 3rd quarter and place the funds in our general operating account. Betty Nash seconded the motion. The Motion was unanimously approved. Don Kersey also advised the Vestry that we could switch to Frontier for \$99.00 a month with no

contract and no installation fee. We would have to pay a penalty fee to Comcast for cancelling our contact early with them. The Treasurer would send a letter to the parishioners that were behind in their pledges. Betty Nash made the motion to approve the Treasurer's report. Peter Taylor seconded the motion. The report was were unanimously approved.

Becky Beckett gave the Senior Warden's report. The Bishop's office sent a letter outlining the guidelines and requirements for his visit on October 22, 2023. Please review the optional questions set forth in the letter. Please forward any responses to Emma at the Church office no later than October 1, 2023. The Vestry and spouses will meet with Bishop Cowden on Saturday, October 21, 2023 at 6:00 p.m. for dinner. David Hardin will cater the reception after the service on Sunday.

A subcommittee will be formed to review the building and grounds polices and guidelines headed by Peter Richardson, Junior Warden.

Peter Richardson gave the Junior Warden's report. He is still working on obtaining quotes for the columbarium doors.



On Sunday October 22, we will have a reception in Rowley Hall after the 10 a.m. service when the Bishop will be here for his annual visitation. On November 12, we will have a carry in luncheon after the 10 a.m. service. Please bring your favorite dish. The Parish Annual Picnic has been set for August 25, 2024 at City Park in Shelter One. Susanne Pulse gave the communications report. Father Paul, Becky Beckett, Mimi Merritt and Susanne Pulse met before the Vestry meeting to discuss the Church's website. Photographs will be updated. Father Paul has already made changes regarding Sunday School on the website. It was discussed that some older items from the website, such as sermons and bulletins, will be housed on the cloud. Father Paul gave the education report. Sunday School is going well. The adult classes are also going well. There are about 9 people interested in reception and/or confirmation when the Bishop visits.

Father Paul gave the Rector's report. He will attend a Clergy Retreat at John XXIII, a retreat center in Charleston, West Virginia, from October 9 to 11, 2023. Convention is in Martinsburg, West Virginia October 26 to 28, 2023. Father Paul will be on vacation from October 29 through November 11. Father Russ Hatfield will fill in on both Sundays.

A discussion was held regarding Christmas Eve services since it falls on a Sunday this year. The Vestry was advised to think about this and it will be discussed at the next meeting.

Father Paul closed the meeting with a prayer.
