Like two intertwined trees, Bob and Peggy Walk each has been an intimate part of the other's life over the last seven decades while traveling life's journey. Both were born and raised in eastern Tazewell County, children of the Great Depression. They married when he was 20 and she was 18. Together they have raised three children, all of whom live nearby. There also are grandchildren.

Bob served in the Army during the Korean Conflict and after a short stint back in the states in private business started a career with the U.S. Post Office that lasted 34 years. Peggy remained at home as a traditional homemaker and the mother of their two boys and a girl, Mike, Mark and Debbie. Responding to an invitation and encouragement from friends of the family, the Walks became members of St. Mary's Episcopal Church in 1957. They moved into their current home in the West Graham section of Bluefield, VA, in 1959.



Fixtures at St. Mary's, Bob and Peggy were active members of the church for the last 60 years of its existence. A Trustee, Bob was among those who had to sign the paperwork to execute the transfer of property from the St. Mary's Parish to the Southwestern Virginia Episcopal Diocese.

I spoke first with Peggy about writing this article before she and Bob reach their 70th wedding anniversary this October 28, 2020. I explained how Mimi Merritt had suggested that I might be best suited to prepare a story for the Rainbow, Christ Church's newsletter. Peggy asked if there was any chance that it might find its way into some "raunchy magazine like Playboy". I told her that I was not planning on taking pictures.

Bob and Peggy are a lovely couple who are devoted to their family and friends, while also warm and welcoming to any stranger they meet. Neither of the two has hesitated as they selflessly welcomed the young and old into their home. As a couple both have experience and an obvious gift with children, showing patience and understanding. If Peggy has advance knowledge of a visit she'll whip up something yummy in her kitchen while Bob will go out of his way to make you feel welcome. Bob is a man of steadfast demeanor and piety, offering his steady support and devotion to those around him. The combination of Peggy's fun-spirited humor and honest nature will brighten your day. As a couple they have provided great memories and given so much joy to the

lives of their friends and family over the years. Both Bob and Peggy are quintessential Appalachian grandparents, with a big dose of fun and spunk. They stand as pillars of support for family, friends and members of their church. Quite a couple.

A member of the vestry for decades, Bob did not wear the honor proudly. Yet, if a need existed, he could be instrumental in finding a solution. Bob, George Strike and Ed Graham were like the Three Musketeers. All were multi-decade members of St. Mary's and the American Legion post that met in the St. Mary's basement. Bob and the other two provided the leadership to establishment of a scholarship endowment at Southwest Virginia Community College. The American Legion post was about to collapse from membership attrition, and they worked to have \$30,000 of the post's treasury transferred to the college's foundation to endow a scholarship for the families of military veterans.

Peggy's culinary skills, combined with that of others like Shirley Ofsa and Margaret Strike, made for a dependable explosion of joyful Christian fellowship, seemingly at a moment's notice. It could be an official church event or other special occasions such as graduations, marriages, etc. A consistent expectation, never disappointed, was that the food at St. Mary's was always good and the fellowship even better.

The Walks and their lack of selfishness remind me of an elderly couple from mythology, Baucis and Philemon. They opened their home to two strangers seeking food and shelter. The strangers had been rejected elsewhere in the community. Despite the modest food stores that Baucis and Philemon had ready for this surprise visit, the four, hosts and travelers, enjoyed an evening of fellowship including more than adequate refreshment. A realization surfaced that these visitors had super-natural powers and likely could grant a wish to their hosts. Yet, all that was requested was that these two elderly hosts might remain united in death.

Bob and Peggy have enjoyed and appreciated the home visits by Rev. Chad Slater. They have expressed a desire and intent to join in worship at Christ Church. However, both have been hospitalized in recent months. Physically attending church would be a challenge. They do look forward to receiving the Rainbow.



VESTRY MINUTES-WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 16, 2020

The regular monthly vestry meeting was held on September 16, 2020.

Father Slater called the meeting to order, declared the presence of a quorum and provided a devotional reading.

Treasurer's Report: Frank Dragotto presented the Financial Report for August 1, 2020 – August 31, 2020. The deficit to date is greater than budgeted even including the PPP Loan deposit, not yet forgiven. The church needs more cash flow into the operating fund. \$4,000 was moved out of the R.J. Fund into the Operating Fund Account. The R. J. Fund is the balance from the window settlement, after placing most of the proceeds into the St Lucie Fund. Year to date all investment account balances are up, in keeping with stock market gains. To preserve cash flow, it was suggested to cut spending and stop all building maintenance, that is not an emergency. A discussion was held on the DeBottis Fund notice process, which must be followed, before those funds can be accessed.

Old Business: Peter Richardson provided a report on completion of the heating/cooling project. A metal screen to block the view of the outside condensing units on Tazewell Street would cost approximately \$8,400. David Hardin suggested planting slow growing hedges to block the view. The cost of shrubbery would be approximately \$2,000. There was some concern expressed over possible vandalism to the units. The Vestry expressed sincere appreciation to Peter Richardson and David Hardin for all of their efforts.

Senior Warden's Report: In the absence of Becky Beckett, Father Slater announced that Pastor Paul has returned to Pittsburgh and Father Slater is back from sabbatical. The Church expressed sincere appreciation for the ministry of Pastor Paul and Reverend Russ Hatfield during Father Slater's sabbatical.

Junior Warden's Report: In the absence of Tom Coughlin, Father Slater observed the progress in Rowley Hall, including the deep cleaning after completion of the column project. Work on the main entrance door upstairs is finished and it is now working properly. Linda Ammar reported a loose/broken railing in the garden area, protecting the window well.

Communications Report: No Report

Education Commission: Elizabeth Clement discussed offering Godly Play lessons online. Volunteers are needed to present the lessons.

Evangelism: No Report

Outreach: Don Kersey reported Food Pantry will be September 17, 2020. Food has been bagged and ready for distribution. Betty Nash contributed masks for distribution.

Parish Life: No Report

Worship: October 4th is the Sunday closest to St. Francis Day. It is World Communion Sunday. There will be a joint outdoor worship with our church, First Presbyterian Church and the Lutheran church in the recently refurbished parking lot on Duhring Street. There will also be a blessing of the animals, so everyone is encouraged to bring their pets. The service will begin at 11:00 a.m. WHIS will broadcast the service. Because the service will be outdoors, we will be permitted to sing hymns.

Rector's Report: Father Slater presided over his Uncle's Funeral and that of Robert Sisk. Father Slater also conducted a wedding Sunday at The Bluefield Inn. The Diocesan Convention will be virtual this year, due to the pandemic. To assist in the selection of a coadjutor, the Diocese has distributed an online survey to all members. Everyone is encouraged to complete the survey. Joe Graham's funeral will be held this Saturday.

New Business – None.

There being no further business, the meeting was closed with a prayer by Father Slater.

Union Mission by Art Mead

On Wednesday, September 9, Episcopalian prepared 93 delicious meals at the Mission. The menu was BBQ on a bun, cole slaw, baked beans, chocolate dessert and beverage.
