A Letter from the Pastor

Welcome to June and summer! This can be a time of change; the kids are out of school, graduates are looking forward to a summer off before the next chapter of life, families and individuals are making plans for vacations.

Here at Christ Church, we are coming out of a "program year" and into a traditionally slower season. In the Church year, the season after Pentecost is referred to as ordinary time. It is the long period of Sundays through the summer and fall that take us to Advent when our church new year begins. It can be daunting when you come to worship on a Sunday morning during the summer and see on the bulletin "The Nineteenth Sunday after Pentecost" and realize you have seven more to go! Ordinary time is a misleading term. We Christians, in the past few months, have journeyed through our Lenten discipline of prayer, scripture study, self-reflection, service and



sacrifice in preparation for the celebration of Easter and the Rising of Jesus Christ from the dead. We recently celebrated the gracious gift of the Holy Spirit to the early disciples, and to us, at Pentecost. The expectation of Ordinary time, therefore, is what do we do with this gift? How do we live out our preparation, our renewal and strength of spirit that we have been developing?

Minutes-CEC Vestry Meeting May 17, 2023

A regularly scheduled meeting of the Vestry was held in the Library, beginning at 7:00 p.m.

Pastor Paul called the meeting to order and declared a quorum.

Susanne Pulse gave the devotional.

Mary Catherine Williams made the motion to approve the minutes of the March meeting and Betty Nash seconded the motion, and the minutes were unanimously approved.

The Vestry members reviewed the financial documents. The financial picture for the church is good and on track. We received two large annual pledge payments in April. Total income for the month exceeded budget by \$6000. Total operating expense for the month was approximately \$17000 and was on target with the budget. Susanne Pulse made the motion to approve the financial documents and Mary Catherine Williams seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Becky Beckett gave the Senior Warden's report. She wanted to thank everyone who assisted with Jay Kephart's funeral on Saturday, May 13, 2023. Upon request of the Vestry, Becky sent thank you notes to the 1912 Foundation and the Tierney Foundation for their generous donations for the roof project. Paul Barker's Letter of Agreement with Christ Church was distributed for review by the Vestry. Becky Beckett and Mary Catherine Williams met with David Hardin to discuss the lunch for Pastor Paul's Ordination on June 17, 2023. David Hardin will provide three (3) options for review and selection. The lunch will cost approximately \$20 to \$23 a plate. David Hardin and Terry Whittington will provide the flower arrangements for the luncheon. A discussion was held on whether to have wine available at the luncheon. Peter Taylor made the motion that wine be served at the Ordination Luncheon. That motion was seconded by Mimi Merritt. It was unanimously approved. The cost of the luncheon may be paid for by the interest from the DeBottis Fund. Don Kersey will verify that no vote by the congregation is necessary to access the interest income on that fund.

Peter Richardson gave the Junior Warden report. Faucets need replaced in the bathrooms on the main floor. Mary Catherine Williams is waiting on Wolfgang Plumbing to provide an estimate for the replacement. Swiftnet will come and evaluate Pastor Paul's desktop computer. It may need to be replaced by either a new desktop model or a laptop computer. It cost \$100 to power wash the stones in the Columbarium. That was paid for by funds in the Columbarium account. The Vestry wishes to thank Jim Pulse for his work on the plaster wall in the hallway. It looks better.

Outreach: Peter Taylor gave the Outreach report. No kerosene vouchers will be given out at the Food pantry in May. The food pantry will be May 18. The Outreach Committee wishes to thank Mary Catherine Williams, Patty Richardson, Chris Justice and Linda Thomas for helping with the donation from the Postal Services' Stamp Out Hunger campaign. David Hardin helped Betty Nash unload the food from her car.

Parish Life: Mary Catherine Williams gave the Parish Life report. The committee met on May 7 to make plans for the Ordination luncheon. The youth group from Pittsburgh will be here June 11 through the 17th. We will have to feed them one night. The Church Picnic will be August 27, 2023, at the City Park, Shelter Number 1. There is a signup sheet in the narthex for Canterbury Club.

Evangelism: Betty Nash has called the Lutheran Church and the Presbyterian Church regarding the community picnic but has not received a response from either church. Betty suggested that Christ Church set up a table at Bluefield State College on Move-In Day, August 4, 2023, and provide water and a snack.

The Vestry would like to give a big thank you to Elizabeth Clement for leading Sunday school.

Communications: Susanne Pulse gave the communications report. The Rainbow continues to be published once a month a weekly e-mail is sent out.

Rector's Report: Pastor Paul had a positive experience at the Clergy Retreat. He will be out on June 3, 2023, for a friend's ordination in Pittsburgh. He will take a week of vacation in July, 2023.

Pastor Paul closed the meeting with a prayer.

Sideline Smokies - Submitted by Becky Kersey (recipe from Betty Crocker)

1 (16 oz) pound of bacon

1 (14 oz) package of little smokie sausages

1 cup of brown sugar

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Cut bacon into thirds.

Wrap 1/3 of each bacon slice around a smokie and secure with a toothpick

Place in a glass baking dish or a jellyroll pan lined with foil. Sprinkle brown sugar on top of each smokie.

Bake 40-45 minutes. Serve immediately or keep warm in slow cooker
