Robbie's mother was our church administrator in the 1970s. Robbie was very active in Christ Church, having served as junior warden. He was editor of the church newsletter and was involved in its renaming. The children of our Sunday School, under the direction of Robbie, created the first Rainbow, published in November of 1993.

## Minutes of Vestry Meeting March 15, 2023

A regularly scheduled meeting of the Vestry was held in the Library, beginning at 7:00 p.m.

Also present was Pastor Paul Barker.

Pastor Paul called the meeting to order and declared the presence of a quorum.

Pastor Paul opened the meeting with asking everyone to express what they are thankful for. He also asked that the Vestry take turns giving the devotional at each meeting.

The minutes of the February 15, 2023, meeting were reviewed and upon motion of Mary Catherine Williams were unanimously approved.

Don Kersey presented the treasurer's report for the period ending February 28, 2023. The financial picture for the church is good and on track. We received \$17,715.00 from the Building Endowment fund for reimbursed building maintenance expenses. Total income for the month exceeded budget by \$10,000.00. Total operating expense for the month was approximately \$15,000.00 and was on target with the budget. Endowment funds were decreased by \$63,000. Betty Nash made the motion that the Treasurer's report be approved; it was seconded by Mary Catherine Williams, and unanimously approved by the Vestry.

Becky Beckett gave the Senior Warden's report. She, Pastor Paul and Peter Richardson met prior to the Vestry meeting. If anyone needs to add an item to the agenda, just let one of the three (3) know. The weekly bulletin has been updated with instructions when to kneel, stand and/or sit. With the HopeWords writer's conference set for the weekend of March 26 at the Granada Theater, there may be a big crowd that Sunday for Church.

Peter Richardson gave the Junior Warden report. A light was replaced in the driveway and a receptacle was replaced in the kitchen. Don Kersey made a motion that Peter Richardson is authorized to accept the bid from Dunford Roofing for replacement of the rubber roof over the office wing and library and to get a bid for the replacement of the third floor roof. There is \$10,000.00 in additional funds from grants received for the roof project. It was discussed that we approach the 1912 Foundation for approval to use the additional funds for another project.

Susanne Pulse gave the Communications report. Becky Beckett, Mimi Merritt, Pastor Paul and Susanne Pulse meet to discuss how better to utilize the Mailchimp program to improve the weekly e-mail.

Peter Taylor gave the Outreach report. Food Pantry will be held March 16, from 9:00 to 11:00.

Mary Catherine Williams discussed if additional food will be needed for the March 26 Coffee Hour since the HopeWords seminar will be in Bluefield that weekend.

Paul gave the Pastor's report. The Organ was tuned. Peter Richardson made the motion to pay that bill. Peter Taylor seconded the motion. It was unanimously approved. The Chamber of Commerce of the Two Virginias sent an invoice for membership. The matter was discussed and it was decided that we would not join at this time. Mary Catherine Williams made the motion to accept the 2022 Parochial Report with one change to Item 6. Betty Nash seconded that motion. The 2022 Parochial Report was unanimously approved. Bluefield City Manager Cecil Marson has invited Pastor Paul to a meet-and-greet with other clergy in Bluefield. The Holy Week schedule was discussed. Pastor Paul will be out March 31 and April 1 for a Commission on Ministry meeting.

There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned and closed with a prayer by Paul.


